

Inside Story Of French Legion Will Be Broadcast

Former Commanding Officer Scheduled To Talk; "Sleep Shop" Creator To Tell Trade Secrets

Inside stories of the French Foreign Legion, of the famous "Sleep Shop" created by Norman Dine, and of all gamblers' aversion to gambling will be revealed on the second broadcast of the Inside Story, over WJZ at 8:00 p. m. Tuesday.

On hand to give a true picture of the most written-about, romanticized unit of any army — the French Foreign Legion — will be Colonel Robert Gerard, former commanding officer of the Legion.

Norman Dine, who originated a sleep establishment specializing in anti-insomnia devices, will tell the behind-the-snore story of how he gets people from "ho hum" to "zzz zz" in a few easy breaths.

Third guest will be Michael MacDougall, celebrated "card detective" who was to have made his appearance on the premiere broadcast.

Fred Sullivan will introduce and interview the personalities. Glen Welty's orchestra will be heard in musical portions.

Producers of "We, The People" in attempting to follow thru on a listener's suggestion that they bring to the microphone living examples of the ancient jingle, "Rich man, poor man, beggar man, thief," for the broadcast over WABC Tuesday, at 9 p. m., are encountering troubles.

Doctors, lawyers, merchants and chiefs also are plentiful in the lists of persons who've written the Listeners' Committee for time on the show. But of poor men who fill the bill there remains a really distressing paucity.

The lowdown on "How to Avoid Good Music" will be ballyhooed, and perhaps pooh-poohed, on Tuesday at 9:30 p. m., when Doctor Rockwell's Brain Trust meets for their fifth blast over WJZ.

Of late Rockwell has appeared incognito in New York's best concert halls and music stores, where he has eaves dropped on devotees and customers who speak their mind. He has amassed some practical hints on how to defend oneself against what is alleged to be good music.

This ramified problem will be chewed on by Doctor Rockwell's co-brainmasters, Agnes Moorehead, Fred Irvin Lewis, Ian Martin, and Eunice Howard. Al Roth, music-master of the 30-piece symphonic-swing orchestra, and Joseph J. Lilley, director of the 14-voice streamlined choir, will demonstrate what they hope is good music.
