

r's Reply t Roosevelt ay Morning

Chancellor Adolf Hitler's speech before the special session of Germany's Reichstag to answer the dramatic plea for peace in Europe sent by President Roosevelt will be heard in this country at 5 a. m. Friday. Stations WIBA, WGN, and WMAQ will air the international broadcast at this time, while stations WBBM and WIND will re-broadcast the dictator's address at 2 in the afternoon to accommodate the non-waking listeners.

Tonight, as a prologue to Hitler's address Friday morning, a round table discussion of the President's peace proposal and the anticipated reply will be aired by station WIBA at 7:30 p. m. Col. W. C. Weaver, Prof. A. P. Fernbach, and Mrs. Joan Swadesh will participate in the discussion.
