Derby Picture, n's Departure ir Saturday

Description of the Kentucky derby and of the departure of Britain's king and queen for Canada will be broadcast on the networks Saturday.

At 7:05 a. m. NBC-WIBA will present a word picture of the arrival of King George VI and Queen Elizabeth at Portsmouth railroad station. A similar report will be carried by CBS-WIND at 7:10. At 7:45 CBS-WBBM will present a description of the rulers' departure aboard the battleship Repulse.

The derby will be aired at 4:15 p. m. through CBS-WBBM with Al Jolson among the commentators. Bryan Field will describe the actual running and Ted Husing will tell about pre-race happenings at the track.

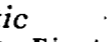
