

Miss Manners, Ross Graham Will Sing Favorite Songs

Pair To Be Heard At 7 P. M. Friday; Old Ranger To Tell Of Historic Hand-Made Hay Press

Eric Coates' "Always as I Close My Eyes," and Fritz Kreisler's "Love Comes and Goes," will be sung by Lucille Manners, soprano, during the program Friday from 7 to 8 p. m. over WFAF. Miss Manners also will be heard in Gershwin's "The Man I Love," and with Ross Graham, baritone, in Stothart's "When I'm Looking at You."

Graham's solo, dedicated to Mothers Day, May 14, will be MacGimsey's "To My Mother," and the ensemble will offer Donaldson's "You" and Carmichael's "Small Fry." Dr. Frank Black will conduct the concert orchestra in Herbert's "Al Fresco," Spanish Dance No. 1 from De Falla's "La Vida Breve," the ballet music from Gounod's "Faust" and the Intermezzo from Wolf-Ferrari's "Jewels of the Madonna." A medley of Irving Berlin song hits, by the ensemble, will conclude the full-hour broadcast.

Farmer Weldon's historic, hand-made hay press will be the subject of the Old Ranger's true story on the Death Valley Days program over WFAF Friday, from 8:30 to 9:00 p. m. Prevented by outmoded equipment from supplying sufficient hay to the livestock owners of Plumas County, Calif., Farmer Weldon set about in 1868 to perfect a hay press. After a four-month search for a flawless oak for the all-important center shaft, Weldon's press began to take form, and upon its completion served its inventor for nine years. The press changed hands several times, and was in active use until recently, when W. D. Thomas of Sacramento presented it to the Sutter Fort Museum.

Songs of the Deep South and the Old West will be contrasted during the Plantation Party program, with Whitey Ford, the Duke of Paducah, as master of ceremonies, Friday, from 8:00 to 8:30 p. m. over WJZ. Louise Massey and her singing Westerners and the Girls of the Golden West will feature several cowboy ballads and melodies of the plains, while Tom, Dick and Harry, vocal trio, and the Southern Planters orchestra revive musical favorites from below the Mason-Dixon Line. In addition to their vocal offerings, Louise Massey and her rancheros, composed of Milt Mabie, Larry Wellington, and Louise's two brothers, Curt and Allen, will display their instrumental talents on the violin, trumpet, guitar, bass and accordion. The broadcast will originate in the studios of WLW.
