## Accompany King at North Amer

### BULLETIN

Delayed by floating ice bergs, the Empress of Australia, carrying the King and Queen of England to Canada, will not arrive in Quebec on schedule. Broadcasts scheduled for the Monday arrival have been cancelled.

When the King and Queen of England arrive in Quebec Monday, the microphone will join the royal party for the remainder of the North American tour.

The opening program, covering the arrival in Quebec and attending ceremonies, will be carried in three broadcasts Monday morning. The times are at 8, 8:45, and 10 over station WIBA. Stations WIBA, WMAQ, and WLS will air the king's address to the Canadian government at 11:45 a. m., while station WBBM will pick up the event at 12:15 p. m.
