

Helen Hayes Will Present Final Silver Theatre Show

Second Part Of "Cross Roads For Two" Set At 5 P. M. Sunday; Benny Gang Will Go On A Picnic

Helen Hayes will ring down the curtain on the "Silver Theatre" series for the season when she stars in the second part of the original drama, "Crossroads For Two," over WABC Sunday, at 5:00 p. m. The series will leave the air for the summer months, returning to the CBS network in the fall.

For the second successive week in the play of war refugees, Miss Hayes will be supported by Carlton Young, Rosalind Green, True Boardman, and Roberto Benberg, her nine-year-old dramatic discovery.

"Crossroads For Two," suggested by the actress' own activities in behalf of war refugees, was adapted for the radio by True Boardman from an original story by Therese Lewis and Hubbell Robinson.

Jack Benny, anxious to renew acquaintances with some old ants, will take his gang on a Decoration Day picnic at Andy Devine's Rancho during the broadcast with Mary Livingstone, Kenny Baker, Don Wilson and Phil Harris' orchestra over WEAF Sunday, at 6:00 p. m.

George Brent, star of motion pictures, will be heard in a one-act radio play with Don Ameche on the program Sunday. Billy Gilbert, the voice of "Sneezzy" in "Snow White" will be the other guest to be heard in the program's WEAF broadcast at 7:00 p. m.
