

Arctic Explorer Scheduled As Circle Guest On Sunday

Vilhjalmur Stefansson To Be Inducted Into Membership Over WEAF; Annabella To Visit Charlie McCarthy

Vilhjalmur Stefansson, who for many years has felt at home in the Arctic Circle, will get his first taste of the gaiety in The Circle over WEAF Sunday at 9 p. m. The famous explorer will be inducted into The Circle's membership on this program instead of Margaret Bourke-White, distinguished photographer, as announced previously.

Regulars on the program include Lawrence Tibbett, Groucho and Chico Marx, Madeleine Carroll, Owen Davis, Jr., Robert Emmett Dolan and his orchestra and The Four-some. Tibbett's numbers will be "The Rogue Song," "The Lord's Prayer" and the Irish folk song, "Wander Shoes."

Anne Charpentier Marabou Power, who to her legion of film admirers is known as Annabella, will become the center of attraction and the object of Charlie McCarthy's affections during the program Sunday, from 7:00 to 8:00 p. m., over WEAF.

The French film actress, who recently became the bride of Tyrone Power, will be starred in a dramatic sketch with Don Ameche and will toy with the heart of Edgar Bergen's fickle dummy. Songs of Donald Dickson, Ameche and Dorothy Lamour, and music by Robert Armstrong's orchestra will round out the full-hour broadcast from Hollywood.

The New Friends of Rhythm, a group of long-haired musicians turned hep cats who made their debut over NBC last March, again will be featured during the Magic Key of RCA program Sunday, from 1:00 to 2:00 p. m. over WJZ.

The full-hour broadcast also will present Eddie Green, Negro comedian, in another of his hilarious "Heroes Was People" sketches; the Family Man, friendly philosopher of the airwaves, and the Magic Key Orchestra, conducted by Dr. Frank Black.
