Arrival of King George VI and Queen Elizabeth on United States soil will be broadcast tonight by NBC and CBS networks. The NBC program starting at 8:15 on WENR, will include Secretary of State Hull's speech welcoming the royal couple, and the king's response. At 8:30, CBS-WBBM will carry a description of the ceremonies on the United States side of Niagara Falls.
