

# Charlie Butterworth To Be Guest Of Powell Tuesday

**Parkyakarkus And Martha Raye Will Join In Fun; "Big Town" Drama Scheduled On WABC At 7 P. M.**

Did you ever hear of a "quicksand farm?"

Well, you'll get the lowdown on such an enterprise, Tuesday, when that droll comedian of radio and screen, Charlie Butterworth, appears as the guest of Dick Powell on the "Tuesday Night Party" program over WABC at 7:30 p. m.

The principal comedy sketch of the broadcast will feature Butterworth, Powell, and Parkyakarkus as members of the French Foreign Legion. Martha Raye is to supply the lure.

"Who is delinquent?" is the pertinent question posed in the current episode of Edward G. Robinson's "Big Town," which goes on the air via WABC Tuesday, at 7 p. m.

It is a dynamic story in which Steve Wilson (Robinson) is instrumental in averting domestic tragedies which are traceable to parental neglect.

The radio play is in no way a preachment, rather a dramatic treatment of the fact that parents, regardless of their background or station in life, are responsible for the character development of their children.

Glenn Cross, baritone, and the Swing Fourteen will offer a novel arrangement of "Sly Old Gentlemen" as a highlight of the Johnny Presents program Tuesday, from 7:00 to 7:30 p. m., over WEA. Johnny Green will be heard as piano soloist with his orchestra in "Wishing," and Roger Kinney and the Swing Fourteen will sing "Old Ark's A-Moverin'." "Tales of the Vienna Woods" and "Is It Possible?" played by the orchestra, and "Tain't What You Do," sung by Beverly and the Swing Fourteen, will round out the musical program.

Solace to men in disfavor with their wives and sweethearts as the result of some unfortunate act, will be given by Tom Wallace during his Uncle Warter's Dog House program Tuesday at 9:30 p. m., over WEA. A series of dramatizations on "How I Got Out of the Dog House" will be featured.

Commander Edward Ellsberg, U. S. N. retired, author of the best seller, "Hell On Ice," and the man who was in charge of raising the sunken submarine, S-51, will tell the inside story of his undersea experiences on the Inside Story broadcast Tuesday at 7:00 p. m. over WJZ.

Of current interest because of the recent Squalus disaster, Commander Ellsberg's interview is expected to shed considerable light on the hazards and technique of undersea operations. Two other guests will tell their inside stories on the broadcast. They are Earl Carroll, specialist in glorifying the American girl, and a noted medical authority who will discuss the uses of sulfanilamide, a new wonder drug of the medical world.

Versatile Helen Wills Moody will add a turn on the Information Please board of experts to her broad experience when the master quiz program goes on the air over WJZ Tuesday at 7:30 p. m. Oscar Levant, almost a regular member of the board, will be on duty again, along with the regulars, John Kieran and Franklin P. Adams.

Mrs. Moody, famed first of all as a tennis star, excels at painting, sculpture, writing, fashion designing and lecturing as well. Her paintings and sculpture have been exhibited in the galleries of New York and California. She recently completed a lecture tour thru 25 cities, including an appearance at New York's Carnegie Hall. An author of books on tennis, Mrs. Moody recently completed a mystery novel to be published soon by Scribner's.
