

# Baker To Plan Moving Day On Saturday Night Program

Phil Will Shift To Wednesday Night Spot July 5;  
Another Oboler Drama To Be  
Broadcast

Comedian Phil Baker, who shifts his program to Wednesday nights beginning July 5, will begin making plans for the move with Bottle, The Andrews sisters and Johnny Pineapple during the "Honolulu Bound" broadcast over WABC Saturday at 8 p. m.

In making the change to Wednesday, Baker loses the service of two staunch supporters. Announcer Harry von Zell and orchestra leader Harry "Snooky" Salter, who leave the show after July 1, because of other Wednesday night commitments. Von Zell is an old timer on Fred Allen's "Town Hall Tonight" program and Salter a charter member of Dave Elman's "Hobby Lobby" program.

So Baker will start a campaign to find replacements. He is not satisfied with Bottle's boast that he can take over the duties of both departing artists. The comedian wishes to smash the growing ambitions of his stooge since he heard Bottle boast that he really is the star of the show and Baker a nuisance.

Raymond Edward Johnson and Betty Caine, NBC artists who have been heard frequently in Arch Oboler's plays, will be co-starred in "The Luck of Mark Street" which Oboler is to present over WEAJ Saturday at 8:30 p. m.
