

# Louis-Galento Title Scrap Will Go On Air Wednesday

Broadcast Of 15 Round Battle Scheduled At 9 P. M.; Gang-Busters Set To Bare Killer's Downfall

The 15-round heavyweight championship bout between titleholder Joe Louis and challenger Tony Galento will be described blow by blow over WJZ Wednesday.

The description of the Louis-Galento battle will be presented from 9 to approximately 10 p. m. direct from the ringside of the Yankee Stadium in New York City.

The bout marks Louis' eighth defense of his title since he defeated former champion James Braddock in seven rounds at Chicago in June of 1937. Galento was recently selected by the National Boxing-association as number one challenger for the crown.

The ruthless murder of a young bank clerk for \$1500 in July, 1933, climaxes the dramatization of the case of the White Hoods gang of New Orleans in the second of two episodes on Gang Busters Wednesday over WABC at 8 p. m. Colonel H. Norman Schwarzkopf will have details described to him by a police officer affiliated with the case.

This will be the final Gang Busters broadcast until it returns to the air this fall.

The White Hoods had gone into hiding for four years, from 1929 to 1933, after they had committed the horrible Whitney National bank massacre which climaxed the first episode. Until then, they had practiced their own criminal philosophy—"strike at high noon . . . people don't expect nothin' then . . . keep shootin' 'cause dead guys don't talk and live guys are too scared."

Sports page devotees will have a field day when Jim McWilliams directs a special "basket" to questions about sporting facts and terms on his final Ask-It-Basket program of the season Wednesday over WABC at 6:30 p. m.

The special basket will cover questions similar to the length of a football field, the scoring in soccer, winners of World Series games, what's meant by a horse being "scratched," the identity of both the "Brown Bomber" and the "Bronx Bombers," etc., etc. They will supplement the usual general questions and the regular "Anything Can Happen" portion of the show.

Tommy Dorsey plays on his program the tunes from the A and B sides of a new Victor record which will be released this week. The numbers are "Well All Right" and "All I Remember Is You." The former is a Dorsey novelty number with a swing vocal by Edythe Wright, the latter a sweet ballad sung by Jack Leonard.

Tommy also plays two tunes by composers whose songs he has been playing a good deal lately. The first is a recent Irving Berlin composition, "I'm Sorry For Myself" from the new movie "Sec-
