

Club Men, Women Will Clash Tuesday In Battle Of Sexes

Queens-co, New York, Residents Will Match Wits; Smashing Of Taxi Racket Will Be Told

Young club men and women of Queens-co, New York City, will make up the opposing teams in the Battle of the Sexes to be broadcast over WEAf Tuesday at 8:00 p. m. Frank Crumit and Julia Sanderson not only will conduct the quiz contest but will sing some of their familiar old song favorites.

The competing teams are drawn from the membership of the Queens-co Council of the Young People's Fellowship. The young men are James Markin, Jr., John Berns, Edward Berns and Jim Montgomery, and the girls are Eleanor Montgomery, Dorothy Romer, Louise Hoyt and Eleanor Rooney.

The smashing of an illegal taxi-cab syndicate will be dramatized during the Mr. District Attorney episode Tuesday at 9:00 p. m., over WEAf. In this episode of the racket-exposing serial, now starring Raymond Johnson in the title role, the District Attorney sends to jail the underworld powers who have strangled an honest business.

Helen Ward, first lady of swing, will make a second guest appearance on CBS' Dixieland Music Shop Tuesday at 8:30 p. m. when she appears with Bob Crosby and Johnny Mercer in a half hour program of down south jive. Crosby and his band will hurry to New York from Atlantic City in time to make several recordings before the broadcast. On the show, Miss Ward and Crosby will sing and the band will play "Skater's Waltz." The Bobcats' contribution will be "She's Crying For Me."

Alec Templeton will introduce audience participation in the second of his series of broadcasts Tuesday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAf when he invites five persons in the studio to name five notes at random. With these five notes, Templeton will improvise a chord and turn it into a rhapsody. Highlight of the half hour show will be Templeton's own operatic impressions and an impression of a broken down phonograph record. Edna O'Dell will sing "If I Didn't Care." Billy Mills and the orchestra will give out with "She Didn't Say Yes," and "Why Do I Love You." Templeton's concerto with the orchestra will be "Honeysuckle Rose."

Elliott Roosevelt, strenuous second son of the President, will take his turn on the Information Please board of experts on the WJZ program Tuesday at 7:30 p. m. Oscar Levant, whose specialty in answering Clifton Fadiman's trick questions is music, again will serve on the board, along with the pioneers and regulars, John Kieran and Franklin P. Adams.
