

Alec Templeton Will Show Musical Tricks On Tuesday

Ace Pianist To Do "Jam Session" With Masterworks And Give Classical Depths To Popular Song Hits

Classic depth to popular song hits and jam sessions with the great masterworks will be in order when Alec Templeton plays musical tricks with the piano during the variety broadcast from Hollywood Tuesday, from 8:30 to 9 p. m. over WEA. Alec will give his impression of popular ditties as they might have been performed by Handel and other eminent musicians, and in contrast, will jazz the classics. Conrad Nagel, master of ceremonies, Edna Odell, vocalist, and Billy Mills' orchestra also will be heard.

An alibi for any occasion will be offered Donald Peterson, originator and manager of the Alibi Bureau, as a feature of Gabriel Heatter's "We, The People" broadcast over WABC Tuesday at 8 p. m.

Other interesting guests selected to tell their own stories will include Leota Lane, the fourth daughter of the famous movie family; Fiddlin' John Carson, America's Number One Hillbilly; and Mr. and Mrs. Thomas L. Reed who recently patched up a lovers' quarrel after 53 years and got married.

Miss Lane will reveal why she turned back on a cinema career, devoting herself to operatic studies instead. The vocalist will sing a number that she introduced on a recent concert tour.

Peterson supplies alibis for any and all occasions at the rate of \$5.00 per alibi. He reports that business has been very good this summer among New Yorkers besieged by World's Fair visiting relatives.

During his sixty-one years, John Carson, of Atlanta, Ga., has written 800 Hillbilly songs. He will sing one of these for Heatter and the "We, The People" audience.

"The Human Adventure," an experimental weekly educational series dramatizing the link between the American university and man's future, is to be presented by Columbia Broadcasting System in co-operation with University of Chicago for a limited period beginning Tuesday from 7:00 to 8:00 p. m. The series will be carried by WHIO. Basic idea of the programs is to dramatize great contributions of college research to the world's welfare and progress. As now contemplated, the broadcasts will present five or six episodes in each show. Sound effects, music and best commercial entertainment techniques are to be used in presenting the material. Scripts will be prepared by University of Chicago and the programs will originate in CBS New York Studios.

Adams and Oscar Levant — on the receiving line when the board of experts meets for another session of the Information Please program Tuesday from 7:30 to 8:00 p. m. over WJZ. Brain-teasers, designed to stump the experts, will be hurled at the board by Clifton Fadiman, who will keep his trigger finger on the cash register, ready to pay out money to listeners whose questions are answered incorrectly.
