

# Miss Manners, Ross Graham To Highlight Radio Hour

Pair To Do Popular "Sweet And Low"; Cowboy Songs To Be Mixed With Southern Ballads

Lucille Manners, soprano, and Ross Graham, baritone, will be heard in Barnby's popular lullaby, "Sweet and Low," as a highlight of the radio concert, conducted by Dr. Frank Black, Friday from 7 to 8 p. m., over WEA. Miss Manners also will sing "Bird Songs at Eventide" by Coates, "La Danza" by Rossini, and "Tell Me Tonight," by Spoliansky, and Graham will be heard in Berlin's "I Poured My Heart Into a Song."

Orchestral selections will include Debussy's "Reverie," "La Danse" from Massenet's "Scenes of Napolitaines," Gould's "Pavanne," and Ellington's "Caravan." The ensemble will be featured in a medley of songs popular in 1920.

They include "Avalon," "Dardanella," "The Sheik," "Whispering" and "Linger Awhile." The Romance of Oil episode will deal with another chapter in the exciting history of the petroleum industry.

Cowboy songs and plaintive melodies of the west will be mingled with ballads of the deep south when Louise Massey and her singing Westerners, the Southern Planters orchestra and Tom, Dick and Harry, trio, gather for another program over WJZ Friday, from 8:00 to 8:30 p. m. Whitey Ford, the Duke of Paducah, will preside over the festivities in his role of host and master of ceremonies.
