## en to Open ly Labor 30 Tonight

Outstanding leaders of labor and industry in America will give their views on problems relating to the country's economic and industrial future in a new series of weekly programs to be presented by NBC in cooperation with the United States department of labor.

William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor, will be heard on the opening program over NBC-WMAQ from 8:30 to 8:45 tonight.

The programs, titled America Unlimited, will be in the form of interviews conducted by officials of the department of labor. Labor leaders will be interviewed on the first six programs and industrial leaders on the last six. Green will be interviewed by Marshall Domock, assistant secretary of labor. He will discuss the contributions of workers toward a happier economic future.

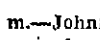

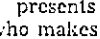
