

"Insurance Murder" Ring To Be Exposed Tuesday Night

Mr. District Attorney Will Dramatize Methods Of Infamous Syndicate; Alex Templeton, Noted Pianist, Heard With Billy Mills

Murder for profit and the smash-up of one of the most infamous rackets in America, will be the subject of Mr. District Attorney's weekly broadcast Tuesday at 9:00 p. m. over WEAF.

With Raymond Edward Johnson in the title role supported by Eleanor Silver, Maxine Jennings, Maurice Franklin, and Leonard Doyle, the half-hour dramatic program written by Harry Herman and directed by Ed Byron will throw the spotlight on inside facts about a murder syndicate operating to collect money on insurance policies.

Ethel Barrymore, leading lady of the stage, will join experts John Kieran, Franklin P. Adams and Oscar Levant on the Information Please program from 9:30 to 10 p. m., over WJZ. Clifton Fadiman, as usual, will do his best to stump the experts.
