

# Famous Commentators Will Clash On Radio Broadcast

## Jay Franklin And Mark Sullivan To Give Conflicting Viewpoints In "Democracy" Series

Opposing viewpoints on America's problems and possible solutions to them, will be expressed by Jay Franklin and Mark Sullivan, nationally known Washington commentators, in another of the "Public Interest in Democracy" series to be broadcast on Wednesday from 9:30 to 10 p. m. over WJZ. Franklin will present the liberal side of the question and Sullivan will offer suggestions from the conservative angle.

Dinah Shore, contralto, and Bill Johnston, baritone, will be featured with Norman Cloutier's orchestra during the Rehearsal Time broadcast Wednesday from 1:30 to 2 p. m. over WJZ. Miss Shore is noted for her swing interpretations of today's song hits.

Eric Siday, English composer and swing fiddler, will direct the Waring Blenders, new instrumental octet, as the highlight of Fred Waring's weekly jam session Wednesday, from 6:00 to 6:15 p. m. over WEA. Featuring special arrangements and original compositions by Siday, the octet is composed of Pennsylvanians Frank Hower, pianist, tenor Stuart Churchill on the drums, "Tools" Bryant, trumpet, "Stinky" Davis, clarinet, Don Purviance, tenor sax, Ernie Moffett, bass fiddle, and Ted Vesely, trombone.

Dr. Bernard Meyers, noted critic and member of the New York university faculty, will be heard in the fifth of his Art on the News series on Wednesday from 5:00 to 5:15 p. m., over the WEA. The series deals with exhibitions, great masters, and news developments in art.

The music from George White's Scandals of 1939 will be broadcast from Tommy Dorsey's program Wednesday just as the curtain is rising on the premiere of this new revue, which will be first-nighting in Atlantic City. Allowing for a curtain on the Atlantic City show at 7:40, Tommy is timing the new tunes to go on the air as closely as possible to the actual opening of the revue.

The new music will be "Good Night, Beautiful" and "Are You Having Any Fun," two popular ballads, and "The Mexiconga," a new dance that George White expects to sweep the country. As he has already swept the country twice with dances — the Charleston in 1924 and the Black Bottom in 1926,—the Mexiconga's chances look good.

Another feature of Tommy's show will be, in addition to the new White tunes by Sammy Fain and Jack Yellen, a "George White Cavalcade" presenting the story of George White's rise to fame as a producer of his famous "Scandals" and other shows.
