# Conducts University Superstition

Arturo Toscanini will conduct a performance of Verdi's "Requiem" during a broadcast from the International Music festival at Lucerne, Switzerland, at 2 p. m. Wednesday over WENR and at 2:30 on WIBA.

Although it wasn't planned that way, exploding of superstitions by a dozen of the world's great universities will keynote the Human Adventure broadcast of the University of Chicago on WBBM at 6 tonight.

So-called "racial superiority," belief that children instinctively fear certain animals, and the once popular belief that "X-ray opera glasses" could make a Lady Godiva out of Juliet are among the superstitions scheduled to be blown up in the fast-paced dramatic hour.

The story of Roentgen's eight-weeks hibernation in his laboratory during the experiments in which X-rays were discovered furnishes a colorful episode in the Human Adventure. How later medical and commercial development of the rays flashed through a bullet-wound case in Toronto and a professor's umbrella handle in London will also be told in the popular educational show tonight.
