Toscanini To Wield Baton On Switzerland Broadcast

Verdi's "Requiem" To Be Heard From International Music Festival At Lucerne

Arturo Toscanini will conduct a performance of Verdi's "Requiem" during a broadcast from the International Music Festival at Lucerne, Switzerland, Wednesday from 3 to 4:45

p. m. over WJZ.

Soloists will include Zinka Milanov, soprano, Kerstin Thorberg, contralto, and Nicolai Moscana, basso, all of the Metropolitan Opera Company. They will be accompanied by a choir and a picked orchestra of 90 men selected from outstanding Swiss orchestras.

The broadcast will be Toscanini's third and concluding radio appearance from Lucerne, and will preface his return to this country to conduct the NBC Symphony Orchestra in its third season of concerts.

Stanley Baldwin, former prime minister of Great Britain, will be heard over WJZ from 9:30 to 10:15 p. m. as he addresses the Congress

on Education for Democracy at the Waldotf-Astona hotel, New York City. Baldwin's talk will be titled "Democracy at Work."
