

Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt To Interview Leslie Peltier

**Amateur Astronomer From Delphos To Explain
Spare Time Activity On Hobby Lobby
Program**

Among the well known guests who will be interviewed by Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt on the "Hobby Lobby" program over WJZ at 7:30 p. m. Wednesday will be Leslie Peltier, of Delphos, one of the world's most famous amateur astronomers. The Delphos astronomer, the discoverer of Peltier's comet, will tell how astronomy can be a fascinating spare time activity.

Mrs. Ruth Bryan Rhode, former United States envoy to Denmark, will be interviewed on her hobby of trailer trips. Vitally interested in rural social conditions, as is the First Lady herself, Mrs. Rhode will describe some of her experiences on these overland trips thru the country.

George Jessel will illustrate his hobby of collecting after dinner sets while the Grandmother's Rhythm Band, composed entirely of grandmothers over 60 years of age, will meet to swing out on the latest songs of the day.

Remaining in Hollywood to complete work on their forthcoming picture, Kay Kyser and his orchestra and entertainers will broadcast their College of Musical Knowledge program from the film city Wednesday, at 9:00 p. m., over WEAF. "Students" enrolled from the studio audience will be examined by the professor on their knowledge of popular music. Entertainment between rounds in the exams will be supplied by the orchestra, with Virginia Simms, Harry Babbitt and Sully Mason as vocalists.

Ella Fitzgerald, the first lady of swing, will be the guest star on the George Jessel Celebrity program over WEAF Wednesday, at 8:30 p. m. Ella, who directs the late Chic Webb's orchestra, will sing her latest recorded hits, "Stairway to the Stars" and "I Want the Waiter With the Water." The orchestra will leave for its first tour under her direction immediately after the program.

It will be "The Second Night of Suspense" in One Man's Family when the popular WEAF serial takes the air on Wednesday, at 7:30 p. m.
