

# The Post Radio Highlights

The Battle of Waterloo, which Napoleon lost on June 18, 1815, is commemorated in Belgium, with music by the Black Watch Bagpipes and a Belgian band playing English, Scotch and Belgian marches—WMAL, 9 a. m.

From Roanoke Island, N. C., the entire cast and chorus of Paul Green's "The Lost Colony" airs a special one-hour adaptation of the drama, which depicts Sir Walter Raleigh's colonists. The Westminster Choir sings the sixteenth century score of ballads and folk music—WJSV, 8 p. m.
