Concert Violinist To Appear On Firestone Program; Former Envoy To Speak On Foreign Affairs

A gay combination of popular and classical music featuring Tony Martin, lyric baritone, David Laughlin, operatic tenor, Kay Thompson, vocal swingstress and the 45-piece "Tune-Up Time" orchestra will be presented by Andre Kostelanetz, music maestro of "Tune-Up Time," over WABC at 7 p. m. Monday.

Handsome Tony, singing master-of-ceremonies of the series, will flutter many a feminine heart with the lovely "Moonlight Serenade," a hit ballad of the season. He will also be heard in a chorus of an orchestral number entitled, "Stairway To The Stars," and with Kay Thompson and her Rhythm Singers in "Over The Rainbow," a hit song from the current film musical, "The Wizard of Oz."

Michael Rosenkerr, well known concert violinist, will be soloist on the Voice of Firestone concert Monday in the absence of Margaret Speaks, soprano soloist, who is on vacation. He will be heard over WEAJ at 7:30 p. m., playing Sarasate's "Gypsy Airs" with the orchestra directed by Alfred Wallenstein, Orchestral numbers include "On the Trail," from Grofe's "Grand Canyon Suite;" Strauss' "Blue Danube Waltz;" "Chickens in Their Shells," from Moussorgsky's "Pictures at an Exhibition," and Selections from Lehar's "Merry Widow."

Oscar Levant, the information source for all questions pertaining to music, will engage that mighty artist of the gas-pipe organ, Colonel Stoopnagle, in a profound discussion of the art during the Magic Key of RCA program Monday. Also on the bill for WJZ broadcast, at 8:00 p. m., is Ozzie Nelson and his Victor Recording orchestra and Harriet Hilliard, vocalist. Nathaniel Shilkret and the Victor Concert orchestra and the Rodgers Sisters round out the program.
