

Goodman And Band Will Be Heard From Cafe On Coast

Young European Actor To Star In Oboler Drama; World's Fair Visitors To Be Interviewed

Benny Goodman and his swing band, starting an engagement at the Victor Hugo Cafe, Los Angeles, will broadcast their program from there on Saturday at 9 p. m. over WEAJ. The Goodman band, trio, and Louise Tobin, vocalist, will take off on a rug-cutting spree with torrid arrangements of popular tunes and classical favorites. Bert Parks will officiate as master of the swing-lingo.

Lew Danis, young European-born actor, will realize an ambition to star in an American drama when he appears in "Love Story," Arch Oboler play for Saturday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAJ. Oboler heard Danis broadcast over a local foreign language station recently, and immediately stamped him as "a young edition of Charles Boyer." Danis comes from a distinguished European theatrical family.

Informal interviews with visitors to the RCA exhibit building at the New York World's Fair will be conducted by Parks Johnson and Wally Butterworth during the Vox Pop program Saturday. The interviews broadcast at 8:00 p. m., over WEAJ, will be climaxed by a parade of visitors before the NBC microphone.

The Vass Family, Lulu Belle and Scotty, Grace Wilson and two Indian girls—Dorothy and Margaret Boscawen—who are skilled in trumpet playing, will be guests of the National Barn Dance Saturday, at 8:00 p. m., over WJZ. The Hoosier Hot Shots will offer "Wabash Blues," Grace Wilson will sing "Sweet Indiana Home," and the Maple City Four will harmonize on "Buckwheat Cakes." Lulu Belle and Scotty will duet "Hang Out the Front Door Key," baritone Skip Farrell will sing "Melancholy Baby," the Vass Family will feature "Start the Day Right," and Henry Burr will present "Love's Old Sweet Song." Joe Parsons' basso solo will be "Bells of the Sea." The broadcast will originate in Indianapolis on the grounds of the Indiana State Fair.

Five-hundred dollars is a lot of money, especially to Izzy Finkelstein of Kaltenmeyer's Kindergarten, who receives that amount for finding the mayor's ring. What Izzy does with the money provides an amusing climax to the Kindergarten broadcast on Saturday, at 5:00 p. m. EDST, over WEAJ. Suggestions for spending the reward are generously offered by Cecile Roy, Thor Ericson, Merrill Fugit and the other pupils of Professor Kaltenmeyer's class.

Two new transcriptions from the pen of Dr. Frank Black, General Music Director of the National Broadcasting Company, will feature the debut, Saturday of the String Symphony under the direction of Dr. Black. The transcriptions, of works by Bach and Smetana, will be heard for the first time anywhere over the NBC-Red Network from 7:00 to 7:30 p. m.

The String Symphony will play five Saturday concerts beginning Sept. 2 and continuing thru Sept. 30. Dr. Black will conduct all five broadcasts.
