

Fibber McGee, Molly Return To Coast-To-Coast Airwaves

Poultry Racket Will Be Subject Of Mr. District Attorney; Battle Of Sexes Also Listed For Tuesday On Chain

Fibber McGee and Molly, who have zoomed to a top-ranking position among the nation's coast-to-coast airshows in the short space of three years, return to the airwaves to commence their fourth season at 8:30 p. m. Tuesday over WEAF.

The leading citizens of Wistful Vista, known in private life as Marion and Jim Jordan, return with Don Novis, singer of the show, and Harlow Wilcox, popular announcer. The couple, recently chosen by the Iowa State-assn of California as the 'Homiest' couple of the radio, return with the outstanding type of humor which has carried them from local station obscurity to their present position.

John Green and his orchestra will review the trend in millady's millinery over the years when they revive the old favorite, "Put On Your Old Gray Bonnet," and introduce the new tune, "I Want a Hat With Cherries," during the Johnny Presents program Tuesday. Other music for the program, over WEAF at 7:00 p. m., will include "Jumpin' Jive," "The Lamp is Low," "Especially for You" and "A Man and His Dream." Floyd Sherman, baritone, and the Swing Fourteen will be featured as vocalists.

The sad story of Tim Davis, whose wife was so tired "she could hardly keep her mouth open," will be told by Tom Wallace, alias Uncle Walter, in his Dog House program Tuesday, at 9:30 p. m., over WEAF. Musical spots will be filled by singers Tom, Dick and Harry, Janette Davis and Bob Strong's orchestra.

Women from the Missouri building at the New York World's Fair will have to be shown by men from the Illinois building when they meet in the Battle of the Sexes on Tuesday. Frank Crumit and Julia Sanderson will captain the opposing teams on the WEAF program at 8:00 p. m. Marjorie Clark, Helen Watkins, Jane Cochran and Mary O'Hara are the Missourians. The men are George Fitzgerald, Alexander Brady, Fred Godwin and Francis Power.

The poultry racket — one which annually takes surreptitious toll on the public pocketbook — will be the subject of Mr. District Attorney's investigation Tuesday, at 9:00 p. m. over WEAF. Acquittal of a gangster who next commits a murder to cover up his tracks, leads to a conviction for the D. A. and the electric chair for the culprit. Eleanor Silver, Len Doyle Maurice Franklin, and Maxine Jennings will assist Raymond Edward Johnson in the title role, with Ed Byron directing.
