Ten of America's outstanding composers of popular music will be commissioned to write as many classical pieces for presentation on the "Good News of 1940" program when it returns to the air Thursday, over WLW at 8 p. m. Willson, musical director of the programs, will present the original compositions each week as the "Concert Hall" feature of the broadcasts.
