"Family" Broadcast Set At 6 P. M.; Jim Ameche And Gale Page Co-Star In "Foreign Affair"

Having reached Kathleen's house party in New England without spending a cent, Henry Aldrich, played by Ezra Stone, finds a scent is his undoing at the dance to which he has looked forward all summer in the broadcast of "The Aldrich Family" over WEAF Sunday at 6 p. m.
