## Chains Reach Agreement On Broadcasting Of War News

Rules Will End "Horror And Suspense," Says Association Head; "Valley Forge" To Be Given Wednesday

The three major radio chains have reached an agreement on the handling of war news, Neville Miller, president of the National Association of Broadcasters, announced Wednesday.

Provisions of the agreement include:

1. Efforts to avoid "horror, suspense and undue excitement."

2. Broadcasters will try to be "temperate, responsible and mature in selecting the manner in which they make the facts of war and its attendant circumstances known to the public."

3. All war news broadcasts should state whether the news is censored.

4. As far as possible, broadcasts from Europe should be made by Americans.

5. News broadcasts will remain in strict control of the

regardless broadcaster, of whether they are sponsored or unsponsored.
