

# War Correspondent To Bare Propaganda Methods On Air

George Seldes Set On Inside Story Program At 7 P. M. Tuesday Via WJZ; Tennis Champ Also Booked

How one may weigh the barrage of propaganda in war news will be discussed by George Seldes, author and former war correspondent, during The Inside Story program over WJZ at 7 p. m. Tuesday. He will illustrate his talk with examples of propaganda methods. Seldes is the author of "You Can't Print That," "The Truth Behind the News" and "Iron, Blood and Profits."

Tennis champion Alice Marble, and Benny "The Eye" Finkle, will also appear on the program. Miss Marble will reveal whether she will try the movies, radio, night club work, or stick strictly to her tennis. Finkle, who has a reputation of being able to fix boxing bouts by hexing the fighter he doesn't like by giving him the eye, will tell if and how he does the trick.

Fable foisting Fibber McGee will attempt to foil his frail, Molly, when the comedy stars broadcast from mythical Wistful Vista Tuesday at 8:30 p. m., over WEAf. Molly, however, promises not to be fooled so easily, since she long has been accustomed to taking everything Fibber says with a shaker of salt. Tenor solos by Donald Novis and music by Billy Mills' orchestra will round out the Hollywood broadcast.

Johnny the Call Boy, and orchestra leader Johnny Green, will team up to offer their comedy version of "Take Me Out to the Ball Game" as a feature of the Johnny Presents program Tuesday. The musical program, at 7 p. m., over WEAf, also will spotlight Green's new tune, "You Brought Me to My Senses." "You Are Old, Father William," "Eighteenth Century Drawing Room," "Ding-Dong, the Witch is Dead" and "Running Thru My Mind" also will be heard.

P. Hal Sims, super sportsman and expert at cards, will engage in about the only kind of contest he hasn't tried yet when he serves on the Information Please board of experts in the WJZ broadcast of Tuesday, at 7:30 p. m.

He is the world champion at bridge, twice amateur champion at three-cornered billiards, twice runner-up in national amateur trap-shooting, is considered by experts to be the world's second best poker player, plays golf in the low seventies and will bet with anybody on anything.
