

Bob Hope Returns To Radio Via WEAF On Tuesday Night

Judy Garland Will Join Genial Maestro In Fun-Making With Jerry Colonna And Ennis Band Also On Tap

Bob Hope, scoring the radio scoop of the season by annexing Judy Garland, a swing queen at sixteen, for his new fall series, will reopen on WEAF Tuesday at 10:00 p. m., with Jerry Colonna and Skinny Ennis' band.

Hope's return to the Pepsodent show after a vacation in England, will occasion the transfer of "Mr. District Attorney," Sunday, Oct. 1st.

Songstress Garland made her radio debut at the age of four in a Los Angeles juvenile program and has been singing ever since. Her first chance to demonstrate talent as a radio comedian came early this year when she made a guest appearance on the Hope show.

This guest shot convinced Hope's sponsor that Judy was ideal for the program, so effective with the opener, she will become a regular member of the program, joining in the general heckling and being featured in a solo spot each week.

Colonna, "the Mad Professor" is the fellow who made "Greetings Gate" a national byword almost overnight. Featured on the screen and on the air, his insane records selling like hot cakes, Colonna is heavily in demand for personal appearances and at this writing is guesting at the Frisco Fair with Hope.

Fibber McGee will continue as the Walter Winchell of the Wistful Vista Gazette when he and Molly broadcast their weekly show Tuesday at 9:30 p. m. over WEAF. Fibber will disclose heretofore untold facts about his Wistful Vista neighbors and Tenor Don Novis will sing "Here Comes the Man With the Mandolin." A supporting cast made up of Hal Peary, Bill Thompson, Harlow Wilcox and Billy Mills' orchestra will also be heard.

In New York for the opening of "Nurse Edith Cavell," movie in which she plays a featured role, Zasu Pitts will be Walter O'Keefe's guest on the second of his new broadcast series Tuesday at 8:30 p. m., over WABC. Bobby Dolan and his orchestra will play "The Little Man Who Wasn't There," while Keenan Wynn, Jack O'Keefe, and Teddy Bergman assist Walter in the department of fun.

When Horace Heidt's program moves into a Tuesday night spot on WEAF at 8:30 p. m., starting Sept. 26, its title will be Pot o' Gold, descriptive of the award to be given a lucky listener each week.
