American attitudes toward the European war will be discussed from two angles—neutrality and propaganda—on the air tonight.

Lyman Bryson's People's Platform on WBBM at 10, will be devoted to "Propaganda and the War." Daniel D. Mich, former State Journal managing editor who now is New York editor of Look, will represent magazines; Elmer Davis will represent radio; Seymour Berkson of International News service will speak for newspapers and wire services, and Jack Haney will talk on behalf of the newsreels.

At 7 p. m., Robert S. Allen, another State Journal alumnus, will join Sen. Sherman Minton (D., Ind.), Rep. James E. Van Zandt (R., Pa.), and Raymond Clapper, columnist, in a discussion of neutrality legislation. The program will be broadcast by WBBM.

Sen. Edward Burke (D., Nebr.) will speak "In Support of the President's Neutrality Policy" at 9:30 on WBBM, and Sen. H. Styles Bridges (R., N. H.) will talk on "The Real Neutrality" at 10:30 through the same station.
