Clark Gable, Ginger Rogers, Margaret Lindsay  
Headline Talent For Production At 7:30 p. m.  
Sunday Over WABC

Clark Gable, Ginger Rogers, Margaret Lindsay, Jane Darwell, Irving Bacon, and Spencer Charters will present a fast-moving comedy about Hollywood scenarists when they appear as Roger Pryor's guests on the Screen Guild Theatre, Sunday, over WABC at 7:30 p. m.

Gable and Miss Rogers are cast as a romantic team for the first time on the air in the comedy-drama, "Imperfect Lady," which concerns two movie writers who are considered "tops" in ability, temperament, and idiosyncrasies.

Bitter enemies because of their similar positions in the writing field, they are forced together when a movie producer decides to have them collaborate on a screen play.
