## Capture Radio Spots Afternoon

WGN will carry the World Series baseball game at 12:15 p. m., and WIND will offer descriptions of Sportsman park's eight races beginning at 2.

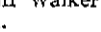
The Cubs-White Sox city series game will be on WJJD at 1:30.

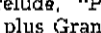

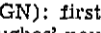

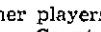
