Four United States senators will discuss neutrality act revision on the People's Platform at 6:30 through WBBM. They will be Elbert D. Thomas (D., Utah), Lewis B. Schwollenbach (D., Wash.), John A. Danaher (R., Conn.), and Gerald P. Nye (R., N. D.).

Pierre Van Paassen, John Gunther, and H. R. Baukhage, correspondents who have just returned from Europe, will be interviewed on "Radio Censorship in Europe" through WIBA-WMAQ at 8. John B. Kennedy will question them.

Montporhasse Forum will return to the air through WIND at 8, with three military authorities speaking on national defense.
