

Jimmy Walker To Be Guest On Berle Program Saturday

Ex-Mayor Will Be Expert "Gag-Buster;" Louis Armstrong Set To Play Hot Trumpet With Goodman

Jimmy Walker, New York's onetime mayor of wisecracking fame, will be up to his old tricks over WEAF Saturday at 8:30 p. m. in the role of expert "gag-buster" on Milton Berle's new Stop Me If You've Heard This One program. He will sit with Harry Hershfield and Col. Jay C. Flippen, permanent members of the "Board of Gag-Busters," meeting Berle's well-known gags with the proper pay-off lines. Emery Deutsch's orchestra will be the guest band for this program, the second of the new series sponsored by the Quaker Oats Company.

Louis Armstrong, one of the most famous colored band leaders and trumpeters in America, will be the second guest star in the new swing-guest series currently heard on the Benny Goodman Caravan programs when he appears as Goodman's guest Saturday at 10 p. m. EST over WEAF, with the Lyn Murray choir.

Louis will play "Shadrack," a famous swing classic based on a Bible story and done in spiritual style, with the Lyn Murray Singers. The playing of "Shadrack" by Louis Armstrong and his trumpet with the voices of the Lyn Murray Singers, a mixed group of men and women, will be of significance to jazz-music followers, as it will be a real reunion. Over a year ago, Armstrong and the Murray group made the recording of "Shadrack" that catapulted the Robert McGimsey song to fame.

guished artists, famed also as author, lecturer and traveller, will assume an entirely new role during the Art For Your Sake broadcast Saturday, when Rockwell Kent plays the title part in a dramatization of his own life. This new art appreciation series is heard each Saturday from 7:30 to 8:00 p. m., over WEAF.

In token of his enthusiasm for this first major effort of an American broadcaster to interpret the great masterpieces of art to the nation, Kent has consented to turn actor for a day. The new art appreciation series features the description of works of famous painters by Dr. Bernard Myers, of New York University's Fine Arts department. The program is presented in cooperation with the National Art Society.

Arturo Toscanini, world's greatest conductor, will direct the NBC Symphony Orchestra in the first of his Fall series of concerts, Saturday, from 10:00 to 11:30 p. m., over WJZ. The Maestro, who conducted at the International Music Festival in Lucerne, Switzerland, last summer, has programmed Schubert's famous "Unfinished" Symphony in B Minor as the opening selection for his initial broadcast. Other works to be performed are Strauss' popular Don Juan, Symphony No. 99 in E-flat Major by Haydn, and Respighi's Passacaglia.

Edmund O'Brien, young Irish actor who was signed to play the romantic lead in "The Hunchback of Notre Dame" a few hours after Hollywood executives heard him perform in "Crazytown," an Arch Oboler drama, will make a return appearance on Oboler's program Saturday at 10:30 p. m., over WEAF.

O'Brien will play one of the only two roles in "The Word," which Oboler first produced on May 27, and which is being repeated by popular request. He attracted wide attention on Broadway as Prince Hal in Maurice Evans' production of "Henry IV." The feminine lead will not be selected until the author-producer of this series reaches Hollywood.

"The Word" is an eerie drama dealing with a young couple who has to walk down from a sight-seeing visit to the observation tower of the Empire State Building to discover that the rest of the world's population has mysteriously vanished.

Pat Barrett, who plays Uncle Ezra, philosopher and wit of the National Barn Dance, will turn stage producer in a dramatization dealing with the purchase of Alaska by the United States in 1867, to be presented during the broadcast, Saturday, at 9:00 p. m., over WJZ.

The drama, "A Tone Poem of Alaska," will trace events leading up to the purchase as well as those which followed. Leading roles in the production will be filled by Cliff Soubier, Marvin Mueller, Helen Dare and Jack Holdel. Guest appearances include Johnny Burke, vaudeville comedian, and Bobby Hastings, 12-year-old boy soprano. Other highlights will be provided by the Housier Hot Shots, Henry Burr, the male octet and girl trio, and the Dezirel Sisters, trick yodeling team.

Only two days late this time — Kaltenmeyer's Kindergarten will celebrate Columbus Day on Saturday, at 6:00 p. m., over WEAF. Izzy Finkelstein (Johnny Wolf) will read an original essay on the subject.

Louis A. Weil, editor of the Port Huron Times Herald, will be the first speaker Saturday, at 10:15 p. m., in a radio series titled "The Editor's Chair," to be presented by WJR at that hour each week throughout the winter.

Leo J. Fitzpatrick, vice-president and general manager of WJR, has asked Michigan and Ohio editors to participate by presenting their editorial views on world and national affairs. The talks will be uncensored and will present the views of the editors and their papers.

The second speaker will be Harold A. Fitzgerald, editor of the Pontiac Daily Press. He will speak on Saturday, October 21st.
