

Tommy Dorsey To Be Guest On Templeton Hour Monday

Sentimental Gentleman With Trombone Will Play Both Sweet And Hot As He And Musical Mimic Show Talents

Tommy Dorsey, that sentimental gentleman with the trombone, will play both sweet and hot as a guest of Alec Templeton during the musical mimic's broadcast, Monday at 9:30 p. m., over WEAJ.

The two talented musicians will go in for a bit of musical nonsense with Dorsey making his trombone sound like a 'cello, a saxophone, a viola or a flute, while Templeton will put his instrument thru its paces in his own inimitable style. A chorus of 12 mixed voices will be heard with the orchestra.

It will not be "elemental, my dear Watson" when Sherlock Holmes solves the mystery of the "Devil's Foot" over WJZ Monday at 8 p. m. Basil Rathbone plays the famed Baker Street sleuth and another film star, Nigel Bruce, portrays the kindly Dr. Watson. Virginia Verrill, famous Broadway songstress and beauty, will be guest star next Monday at 8:00 p. m. over WEAJ on the Tommy Riggs and Betty Lou program. Miss Verrill's specialty number will be "Are You Having Any Fun?" Tommy Riggs will sing "Scatterbrain," and Betty Lou, his vocal other personality, will do "Piggy Wiggy Woo." Freddy Rich and the orchestra will supply the music, and will give a special orchestration of the favorite Mexican song, "El Rancho Grande." David Ross, the golden-voiced announcer, Charley Kemper, Teddy ("Blubber") Gergman, and others, will participate in the proceedings.

An interesting program of familiar melodies against a background of novel orchestral arrangements will be presented by Andre Kostelanetz and his "Tune-Up Time" principals Monday at 8 p. m. over WABC.

Master-of-ceremonies, Tony Martin has chosen the amusing "Go Fly A Kite" from the musical movie, "The Star-Maker" for his opening solo. Later in the broadcast, Tony will also be heard singing "When I'm Looking At You," one of the famous love ballads from the "Rogue Song."

For his orchestral selections, Maestro Kostelanetz will play his own composition, "The Man On The Flying Trapeze," a contrapuntal novelty inspired by the popular song of the same title. In sharp contrast to this lively composition the other featured orchestra selection will be a tone poem arrangement of the romantic ballad, "Moonlight Madonna."
