Stassen, Minnesota, on "Labor;" Mayor F. H. LaGuardia, New York City, on "The Large City;" Mayor J. McLevy, Bridgeport, Conn., "The Smaller Cities;" Lewis Douglas, insurance man, and Dr. Harry Gideonse on "The Layman;" John W. Hanes, under-secretary of the treasury, on "The Revenue Problem;" Sen. J. C. O'Mahoney (D., Wyo.), on "Controlling War Profits;" and Morris W. Tremaine, comptroller of New York, on "Hidden Taxes."
