

Radio's Youngest Stars To Be Guests On Allen Show

Play That Brought Fame To Katharine Hepburn To Be Given Airing; Landon To Speak On Foreign Policy

Fred Allen will play host to radio's youngest stars, the Moylan Sisters, in his variety hour broadcast with Portland Hoffa, The Merry Macs, Wynn Murray, Harry von Zell and Peter Van Steeden's orchestra over WEAF, Wednesday, at 9:00 p. m.

In the role of Coach Spike Allen, Fred Allen will lead his Mighty Allen Art Players in an epic of the gridiron titled "Is a Half-baked Halfback a Quarterback" or "Should Fullbacks Pay Income Tax." Harry von Zell is slated for the part of Juggernaut Mulligan, All-American Fullback. On the eve of the big game Juggernaut is jailed for non-payment of income tax on his \$200 a week salary from the college. Coach Allen saves all, however, by importing the veteran of a dozen Hollywood football movies.

The play that brought Katharine Hepburn film fame will be adapted for radio and presented on the Star Theatre Wednesday, when "Bill of Divorcement" co-starring Pauline Lord, Walter Abel and Betty Fields, is broadcast at 9:00 p. m., over WABC.

Miss Fields, formerly starred on Broadway in "What a Life," and currently starring in a movie version of the same hit, will play the role originally created by Hepburn. Miss Lord and Abel, both well known stage and screen stars, will be heard as the parents in this story of a woman married to an insane man, whom she divorces to marry a man she loves. After obtaining the divorce, the husband comes back, cured, from the asylum. The resultant problem is solved by the daughter's cooperation.

The challenge of youth will be met by Tony Canzoneri, former lightweight boxing champion, when he engages Al Davis, rising young aspirant for fistic honors, in a bout to be broadcast from the inside in Madison Square Garden, Wednesday at 10 p. m. over WJZ. The double-play combination of Bill Stern and Sam Taub will describe the color and action during the scheduled 10 rounds, Taub calling the blows.

Former Gov. Alfred M. Landon, of Kansas, Pres. Roosevelt's opponent in the 1936 campaign, but a supporter of the administration's foreign policy since the European crisis developed, will speak on "Our Foreign Policy" over WJZ Wednesday from 9 to 9:30 p. m. Gov. Landon's address will be picked up from Shenandoah, Ia., via NBC affiliate KMA.
