

Kate Smith Program To Be Broadcast From Hollywood

Entire Cast Will Make Continental Jump For Friday Program; Football Games Going On An Saturday

The entire Kate Smith program will be transferred to Hollywood for the broadcast Friday over WABC at 8 p. m. The feature of the variety show will be a special dramatization of the technicolor film "Drums Along the Mohawk" with Claudette Colbert and Henry Fonda stars of the screen version heading the air cast.

This is the first time on record that a complete radio program has been moved all the way across the continent for the purpose of broadcasting a motion picture preview.

Kate Smith, the singing mistress-of-ceremonies, Ted Collins, Jack Miller, orchestra leader, Ted Straeter, director of the chorus, and other members of the regular troupe will make the round trip.

Daniel F. Zanack will also appear on the program to dedicate the picture to Miss Smith for her outstanding Americanism.

Football songs of South Florida and Arizona universities provide musical pep by John Green's orchestra on the "Johnny Presents" program over WABC at 9 p. m. Friday. Other tunes are "Last Night" Alice in Wonderland, "You Are Old Father William," "South of the Border," "I'll Follow My Secret Heart" and "Stop It's Wonderful."

Green will contribute two piano solos and vocalists are Genevieve Love and the Swings Quartet. There will be another Max Baer "Perfect Crime" story directed by Jack Johnson. Enjoy one Call Boy acts in a series of ceremonies.

McClellan, last rising radio star of 1935, will be the guest on a special interview broadcast over WJW on Friday in connection with his appearance in Cincinnati for a Smith College Scholarship Fund Concert. The program will be heard 8:45 p. m.
