

# Goodman To Play New Swing Version Of Old Popular Hit

"Down By The Old Mill Stream," Will Be Offered By Maestro Saturday Night; Berle Has Ward Wilson As Guest

Benny Goodman's band will do a special swing treatment of that old favorite "Down By the Old Millstream," Saturday at 10 p. m. over WEAJ. The boys will also give out with the popular swing version of Ravel's "Bolero." Mildred Bailey, the song star, will sing two songs: "I Didn't Know What Time It Was," and "Scatterbrain." The sextette will play a specialty number.

Ward Wilson, the fellow who made "Beetle" a personality on the Phil Baker show for almost 10 years, will be the guest gagbuster for Milton Berle when the comedian broadcasts his weekly "Stop Me If You've Heard This One" program over WEAJ Saturday at 8:30 p. m.

Working with Berle and gagbusters' board, Harry Herstfield and Jay C. Flippen, Wilson will attempt to bust the payoff lines on a series of gags contributed by listeners. Del Courtney's orchestra will be the guest band.

What's My Name?—popular radio quiz program which replaced the first half of Fred Allen's Town Hall Tonight during the summer, will return to the air Saturday with Budd Hulick and Arlene Francis handling the show.

The program will be heard at 7 p. m. over WJZ.

For the second concert in his six-week Beethoven cycle, Arturo Toscanini will direct the Radio Symphony in two of the great composer's less frequently heard works for the Saturday broadcast. The program will open at 10:00 p. m., over WJZ with a presentation of Beethoven's Second Symphony in D Major, after which the Fourth Symphony in B-flat Major will be performed. The concert will close with the famous "Lenore" Overture No. 3.

Bary Wood will make his starring appearance as featured vocalist and master of ceremonies on the "Hit Parade" series over WABC beginning Saturday. He is one of the three Yale university graduates who have risen to the top in radio. The other two Eli alumni are Lanny Ross and Rudy Vallee.

Lyn Murray's singers have been engaged for the choral division of the "Hit Parade," starting with the broadcast. Murray's choral groups are outstanding in radio, and have long been featured on many of the topnotch musical programs.

With the return Saturday of the Renfro Valley Folk to their homes in Renfro valley, Ky., the "Renfro Valley Barn Dance," a weekly WLW feature for more than two years, becomes that in a literal sense. All broadcasts by the organization, headed by John Lair, will originate in "The Old Barn" in the valley, at 7:30 p. m. each Saturday.

It is believed that the programs will be the only one of its type originated in such fashion, with a rural background. John Lair, Red Foley, Whitey Ford (the "Duke of Paducah"), Aut Idy and Little Clifford, with the Coon Creek Girls, Slim Miller and others, already have reestablished their homes in the valley.
