

Templeton Plans New Style For "Spring Song" On Hour

Mendelssohn's Famous Composition As Played On Broken Down Nickelodeon To Be Imitated

Mendelssohn's "Spring Song" played on a broken-down nickelodeon will be imitated by Alec Templeton on his program Monday at 9:30 over WEAJ.

Alec also will renew an old friendship with Pat O'Malley, British-born entertainer, who made his American debut four years ago with the pianist-mimic when they were members of Jack Hylton's orchestra. O'Malley will revive his famed monologue, "Albert and the Lion" and will sing "The Adventures of Ann Boleyn with her head Tucked Under her Arm."

Richard Crooks is scheduled to return for the Monday broadcast heard at 8:30 p. m. over WEAJ.

For his opening program Crooks will be heard in "Tosti's Good-bye," "Songs My Mother Taught Me" by Dvorak, "L'Adieu Furtiva Lagrima" from Donizetti's "L'Elisir D'Amore" and Glover's "The Rose of Sharn." Alfred Wallenstein will conduct the orchestra in the overture to Rossini's "Barber of Seville," Glazounow's "Autumn" from "The Seasons" and Tschai-wsky's "Valse Des Fleurs."
