

How Cunning Criminals Fell Prey To The Law To Be Told

Col. Schwarzkopf Will Bare Details Of Minnequa Bank Robbery Case On "Gang Busters" Program Saturday

Two of America's most cunning criminals holding up a crowded bank in broad daylight . . . a wild automobile drive of 2,500 miles in two days . . . an airplane crash that cheated the police . . . all feature the dramatization of the Minnequa Bank Robbery Case on Gang Busters program Saturday at 8 p. m. over WAAC.

Details of the long nationwide police search for these criminals will be related to Col. H. Norman Schwarzkopf, interviewer on the program, by an official closely connected with the case.

After serving a sentence at San Quentin for assault and attempted robbery, Harry Howard joined William Bashaw in executing a series of hold-ups in 1934. With the proceeds they set up a garage business in Benton, Wash. in an attempt to go straight, but this effort was short lived.

They soon made a secret trip to Pueblo, Colo., to hold up the Minnequa bank. Both escaped, but Bashaw later met death while taking flying lessons. Howard, with desperate criminal cunning, had omitted nothing in covering up his escape except to use a favorite ejaculation—"Great Jumping Bullsnaakes." This apparently harmless phrase proved his eventual undoing, as the program will reveal.
