Philharmonic Saxophone Solo Come Tonight

Rudy returns to the air as a "m-c" tonight when he joins the Variety Hour, program headlined by Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy, for a limited engagement. The crooner replaces Don Ameche, who is recovering from an illness.

For the first time a saxophonist will appear as soloist with the New York Philharmonic-Symphony orchestra in its broadcast today. The artist will be Sigurd Rascher, who will play two compositions for saxophone and orchestra, one by Ibert, the other by Debussy. The concert will come through WBBM at 2 p. m.
