

Favorite Songs To Be Sung By Crooks Monday Evening

Radio Rogues Will Make Third Guest Appearance On Quaker Party; Atlantans To Appear On "True Or False" Hour

Richard Crooks will sing one of his most frequently requested songs, "Mother O' Mine," during the Wallenstein program Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAF.

The Metropolitan Opera tenor also will be heard in "Believe Me If All Those Endearing Young Charms," by Moore; "Ah Moon of My Delight," by Lehman; and "Spanish Serenade," by Carnevali. Alfred Wallenstein will conduct the symphony orchestra in the Dance of the Comedians from Smetana's "The Bartered Bride."

The Radio Rogues, making their third guest appearance on the Quaker Party, will share spotlight honors with guest vocalist Fredda Gibson, contralto blues singer, on the Tommy Riggs and Betty Lou program, Monday over WEAF at 8:00 p. m. EST.

Fredda, last heard on the Hit Parade, will sing "How Deep Is The Ocean?" and Tommy will sing "I'll See You In My Dreams." Betty Lou's song will be "Oh, Hap, Hap, Happy Day." Freddie Rich's orchestra will play.

Works by Mozart, Debussy and Handel have been programmed by Guy Fraser Harrison for the radio concert by the Rochester Civic Orchestra Monday at 9:00 p. m. over WJZ. The broadcast, opening with the Overture to Mozart's "The Marriage of Figaro," will be followed by Debussy's "Afternoon of a Faun" and Handel's ballet suite, "The Gods Go A-Begging."

That master of paradox, Ray Perkins, will play "Moon in Third Quarter," his latest composition written in four quarter time for Clarence, his sniggling piano, on Monday at 6:30 p. m. over WJZ. Ray says the selection is his first attempt at concert swing.

Erudite Atlantans will match wits on the True or False program when Dr. Harry Hagen presents the quiz show from the Southern metropolis on Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WJZ. The broadcast will originate in the studios of WAGA, NBC Atlanta affiliate.

The riddle of "The Dying Detective" will be solved by Sherlock Holmes and Dr. Watson during the dramatization of the Arthur Conan Doyle mystery on Monday at 8:00 p. m. over WJZ. Basil Rathbone, in the role of the Baker Street sleuth, finds himself at death's door for the first time in his career. Nigel Bruce will portray Dr. Watson.

The life story of Tyrone Power, which will be dramatized in three installments, will be featured on "Hedda Hopper's Hollywood" heard Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 6:15 p. m. EST on WABC, starting with the broadcast of Monday. In addition this real-life story, which is a feature of "Hedda Hopper's Hollywood," the actress-columnist presents exclusive and last-minute news of the film capital's doings.

Gene Krupa, "prince of percussion," will drum up a three-way jam session with Alee Templeton and Pat O'Malley when he appears on Alee Templeton Time Monday at 9:30 p. m. over WEAF. With Templeton at the piano and O'Malley doing the "hot" singing, Krupa will beat out the old favorite "After You've Gone."
