

# Gang Busters To Dramatize Story Of "Blonde Tigress"

## Col. Schwarzkopf Will Bare Secrets Of Battle Of Wits Between Courageous Policewoman And Female Criminal

When Reno, having advanced to the rank of general, was killed in action, news of his death reached the two prospectors in a little eating-place out on the Nevada desert. The only action they could take in his honor was to name the place "Reno."
