Honors Set For Schools Friday Evening; "Quiz Marathon" Uncovers Eridute Gotham Hosiery Salesman

Dartmouth, Oklahoma university and Temple will be saluted in a special football medley of Johnny Green and his orchestra with the Swing Fourteen on "Johnny Presents" over WABC Friday, at 9 p. m.

Other numbers will be "Goody, Good-Bye," "Make With the Kisses," "I Didn't Know What Time It Was" and "All the Things You Are." Vocalists are Glenn Cross and Genevieve Rowe.

The dramatization will be another of Max Marcin's "Perfect Crime" stories, this time "The Tell-Tale Clue." Introductions are by Johnny the Call Boy.

"O. K. Oklahoma," newest Fred Waring composition in the series of original college songs, will get its sendoff on Fred's Pleasure Time program over WEAJ Friday at 7 p. m. University of Oklahoma students and graduates will hear the Waring 55-voice Glee club introduce the new pep number.
