

# Hayloft Gang To Herald Arrival Of Winter Soon

## Alec Templeton, Pianist-Parodist, To Be Honor Guest; Meet The Artist Conductor To Guestar With Milton Berle

With Alec Templeton, pianist-parodist, as guest of honor, Uncle Ezra and the hayloft gang will herald the arrival of winter on the National Barn Dance, Saturday at 9:00 p. m. over WJZ Network. The guest list also will include Jane Kaye, blues singer, and Caroline and Mary Jane DeZurik, novelty singers.

A trail of crime that led from New Hampshire to Texas, bringing death and terror in its wake, will be described in the dramatization of the case of "The Scarface Man," on Gang Busters, Saturday, over WABC at 8:00 p. m. A police official associated with the case will relate the details to Colonel H. Norman Schwarzkopf.

Nellie Revell, conductor of Meet the Artist program, will be the second woman gag-buster to appear on Milton Berle's Stop Me If You've Heard This One, during the Saturday broadcast at 8:30 p. m. over WEAJ. Miss Revell will have the assistance of Col. Jay C. Flippen and Harry Hershfield.

Martha Deane, radio home economics expert, whose real name is Mary Margaret McBrine, will headline Cal Tinney's Youth vs. Age show over WJZ Saturday at 8:30 p. m. Odds are being wagered that she will have Tinney reciting recipes before the intelligence test ends. Thirty Boy Scouts from Derby, Conn., will be in the audience and between a member of the surrogate's court, some college students and writers, a fourteen-year-old youngster will hold the fort for the Youth team.

Conquest of the new world by Sir Francis Drake will be the basis for the Old Ranger's narrative during Death Valley Days, Saturday at 9:30 p. m. over WEAJ. In 1597, Drake landed a party about 30 miles from what is now San Francisco, built a make-shift fort, and claimed the land for Queen Elizabeth.

JS Gray, president and editor of the Monroe Evening News, will occupy "The Editor's Chair" at WJR at 10:15 p. m. Saturday. Mr. Gray will be the eighth speaker in the radio series in which noted editors of Michigan, Ohio and Indiana discuss current affairs.

JS Gray was born in Ohio, Michigan, in 1890. His initials are his given name. They do not stand for anything and are an annoyance to printers who want to put periods after them.

After receiving his liberal arts degree at Adrian college, Mr. Gray intended to study law but gravitated to newspaper work instead, and was managing editor of the Adrian Telegram from 1918 to 1927 when he embarked upon his present newspaper work at Monroe.

JS Gray is a former president of the Inland Daily Press-assn; a former president of the Michigan Associated Press Editorial-assn and of the University of Michigan Press club; a member of the American Society of Newspaper Editors; and, during the last two years, has

been chairman of the radio committee of the American Newspaper Publishers-assn, representing the dailies in their contacts with the radio industry. His editorials on state and national issues have been widely quoted. Last June, his alma mater conferred upon him the honorary degree of doctor of laws.

During the World war, Gray served overseas as lieutenant, captain and major — a commission which he later relinquished.

In 1912 he married Harriett Taylor in Adrian. He has a daughter, Thorne, sophomore at Vassar, and two sons, Crattan 11, and Whitmore 7.
