

# Sensational Swing Sax Man To Be Guest Of Templeton

Boyce Brown Set As Feature Of Broadcast At 9:30 P. M. Monday; Switzerland Will Get Musical Salute

Boyce Brown, hailed in Chicago swing circles as one of the outstanding alto saxophonist discoveries of the age, and Edna Odell, songstress, will be Alec Templeton guests Monday, at 9:30 p. m., over WEAJ. It will be Browns's first appearance on a network broadcast. Miss Odell starred with Templeton during his summer series of broadcasts over NBC. William Miller's chorus and Daniel Saldenberg's orchestra will be heard as usual.

The traditional "Drink To Me Only With Thine Eyes" will be Richard Crooks' opening selection for the concert, Monday, at 8:30 p. m., over WEAJ. Crooks also will sing Del Riego's "O Dry Those Tears," The Dream from Massenet's "Manon" and Aylward's "Beloved It Is Morn." Alfred Wallenstein will conduct the orchestra in the Bacchanale from Saint-Saens' "Samson and Delilah," Tschaiikowsky's "Sleeping Beauty Waltz" and the "Moto Perpetuo" of Strauss.

Switzerland will be the subject of an international musical salute at 10:00 p. m., over the NBC-Red network. Opal Craven will have Ribaupiere's "Swiss Lullaby" as her solo and Josef A. Pasternack will direct the orchestra in Fossini's amous "William Tell" overture as highlights of the program. These selections by Leopold, "Der Alte Bernersmarsch," "Landler Medley" and "Helvetia" with the Continentals Chorus also will be heard.

Andre Kostelanetz has arranged a special medley of the top tunes from George Gershwin's "Porgy and Bess" which he'll offer on his "Tune-Up Time" program Monday, at 8 p. m. over WABC. Included are "It Ain't Necessarily So," "Summer Time" and "I'm On My Way." The conductor will also present a novel version of the Arthur Schwartz hit, "I See Your Face Before Me." Kostelanetz is doing the Gershwin selections because of popular demand from his many listeners.

The University of Pennsylvania, where more than 200 student fans sent Andre a petition, requested that he play "Stop! It's Wonderful" from the annual college Mark & Wig Show, "Great Guns." Since the tune is at present high on the popularity lists, and the show opened in New York on December 1, Andre needed very little coaxing to include it in his December 4th program.

The last in a series of reports prepared by the American Youth Commission will be given during the Youth in Crisis broadcast Monday, at 9:30 p. m., over WJZ. "Good Schools For All" will be the subject presented under the direction of Dr. Floyd B. Reeves. Formed four years ago by the American Council on Education, the commission has based its report on the major problems confronting America's young people in the present world crisis.

Nan Wynn, formerly vocalist with Hal Kemp, will be chief guest soloist on the Tommy Riggs-Betty Lou program Monday, 8:00 p. m. over WEAJ. It will be a reunion for Miss Wynn and Riggs' orchestra leader, Freddie Rich, with whom she made a movie short about this time last year. Born in Wheeling, W. Va., May 8, 1918, songstress Wynn used to be known as "Suzanne" on the CBS network.

"The Adventures of Charles Au-

gustus Milverton," one of the most popular of the Sir Arthur Conan Doyle mystery stories, serves as the starring vehicle for Basil Rathbone in the "Sherlock Holmes" series over the NBC-Blue network Monday, Dec. 4, at 8 p. m., E. S. T. The story revolves around a blackmailer and what happens to him when the Baker Street sleuth gets on his trail. Nigel Bruce has the top supporting role as Dr. Watson. "Sherlock Holmes" is adapted for the microphone by Edith Meuser.
