

# Gang Busters To Give Case Of Architect Of Crime

Col. Roscoe Turner To Be M. C. On New Weekly Radio Show Devoted To Exploits Of American Aviators

Eddie Bentz, the only underworld character who out-smarted John Dillinger, drew up blue print plans for bank robberies, several of which will be dramatized on Gang Busters, Saturday, at 8:00 p. m., over WABC. The details will be related to Colonel H. Norman Schwarzkopf by an officer connected with the case.

Bentz, known as the "architect of crime", learned the approximate sum of money stored in a bank on certain days by consulting newspaper files in the public library. But the success of his ventures, for which he regarded himself as intellectually superior to the police, went to his head. After cutting a wide swathe of crime throuout the country, he met his defeat at the hands of police he had scorned for so long.

Colonel Roscoe Turner, winner time and again of the coveted Harmon and Thompson aviation trophies, will be master of ceremonies on Sky Blazers, the new weekly radio show dramatizing the true and daring exploits of men and women who pioneered the airlines.

The new aviation series, with Colonel Turner at the controls, will be heard weekly over WABC starting Saturday at 7:30 p. m. Each broadcast will present dramatized adventures of a famous pilot.

Peter Lorre, famous screen player, will be starred in "Nobody Died," Arch Oboler drama to be presented from Hollywood Saturday, at 9 p. m., over WEAf.

What would the elixir of youth do to our modern civilization? That is the question propounded by Oboler's play, a development of an idea first presented in the young author-producer's "Immortal Gentlemen."

Lorre gained an international reputation as portrayer of a psychopathic character when he appeared in "M," great German horror film. He has been the star of several "Mr. Moto" pictures. In his first American broadcast Lorre was a guest of Rudy Vallee on NBC, as star of Oboler's "Prelude to Murder."

Once more the accent will be on youth when teen age girls and boys discuss and demonstrate their hobbies during the Bright Idea club session, Saturday at 10:30 a. m. over WEAf. Guests to appear on the program will be John Coleman, cross-country runner from Manual Training high school,
