

Three Favorites Are Cast In Love Story Play Monday

Carole Lombard, Cary Grant And Kay Francis To Do Air Version Of "In Name Only"

When the Radio Theatre's marquee lights up on Monday, Carole Lombard, Cary Grant, and Kay Francis will be the names over the production, "In Name Only." This is the same cast which appeared in the successful movie and the trio will be heard under the guidance of Cecil B. DeMille at 9:00 p. m. over WABC.

"In Name Only" is the love-story of Julie Eden, played by Miss Lombard, and Alec Walker, enacted by Cary Grant. The complicating factor in the story is Alec's wife, Maida, an unsympathetic part portrayed by Kay Francis.

The sweet-swing singing Andrew Sisters — Fatty, Laverne and Maxene — will guest star on Alec Templeton Time over WEAJ Monday at 9:30 p. m. They will offer their unusual interpretations of popular songs and will join Templeton in his improvisations. Pat O'Malley, William Miller's Chorus and Daniel Saidenberg's orchestra round out the broadcast.

"The Musgrave Ritual," a story of how Sherlock Holmes unearths a buried treasure, will be the "Adventures of Sherlock Holmes" offering on Monday. Basil Rathbone enacts the role of the famous fictional detective, "Sherlock Holmes," with Nigel Bruce as his sidekick, "Dr. Watson," over WJZ at 8 p. m.

Harry McNaughton, radio's famous "Bottle," will inject his dry wit into the Quaker Party when he appears as guest of Tommy Riggs and Betty Lou Monday at 8:00 p. m. over WEAJ. Vocal honors will fall to Deane Janis veteran kilocycle crooner model, and former vocalist with Hal Kemp's orchestra, who will be heard with Freddie Rich's orchestra in popular songs.

Toselli's Serenade will be sung by Richard Crooks, tenor, as a feature of the Voice of Firestone program, Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAJ. Crooks also will be heard in "The Bell Man" by Forsyth, the Berceuse from Godard's "Jocelyn" and "Morning" by Speaks. Alfred Wallenstein and the symphony orchestra will play the Finale to Tchaikowsky's Fourth Symphony, Anitra's Dance from Greig's "Peer Gynt" suite and Rimsky-Korsakoff's "Dance of the Buffons."

A strange Englishman on the Bumstead doorstep turns out to be the valet of Dagwood's cousin, Sir Edgar Pheemy Bumstead, during the weekly Blondie broadcast Monday at 7:30 p. m. over WABC. Billy Artz will furnish the musical background for the ensuing confusion, cleared up when Pheemy, in America working in a coal mine to gather material for a sociology book, returns to save the day.

One of Andre Kostelanetz's favorite popular ballad arrangements — "Too Marvelous For Words" — and excerpts from Stravinsky's famous symphonic "Fire Bird" will be the compositions spotlighted on the maestro's "Tune-Up Time" program at 8 p. m. Monday over WABC. The "Fire Bird" selections will be the "Berceuse" and the Finale.

Continuing the George Gershwin series he inaugurated last week with "Porgy and Bess" suite and "S Wonderful", Andre will accompany Tony Martin in the presentation of Gershwin's "Of Thee I Sing," the program's opening number.
