

Sky Blazers Will Present Man Who Made First "Loop"

Howard Rinehart Will Tell Of Performing Daring "Outside" Circle And Of Adventures In Hunt For Black Diamonds

The thrilling exploits of Howard Rinehart, who flirted with death as the first pilot ever to maneuver his plane thru a dangerous "outside loop," will be dramatized on the second Sky Blazers broadcast, Saturday over WABC, 7:30 p. m.

Sky Blazers will reveal how Rinehart, who received his first flying instructions from Orville Wright, later became one of the foremost teachers of flying as the chief instructor of the Orville Wright Aviation school.

The story of his search for black diamonds along a little-known tributary of the great Amazon river, is given in an exciting dramatized sequence. Rinehart and his party were captured by head-hunters after struggling for months against the dangers of the jungle fastness.

The fate that befell the Rinehart party, all prostrate with fever and threatened with death by their captors, provides a thrilling climax.

Tony Martin, popular tenor and screen star, will be guest wisecracker during Milton Berle's Stop Me If You've Heard This One, Saturday, at 8:30 p. m. over WEAJ. Martin, whose ready wit is well known, will bust a few gags with the assistance of Harry Hershfield and Col. J. C. Flippen. Vincent Travers and his orchestra will furnish the musical background.

The criminal saga of another "Little Caesar," Sid Power, who terrorized Boston with sensational holdups for almost two years, will be dramatized in two installments on "Gang Busters," beginning Saturday, over WABC at 8 p. m.

Desire Defauw, noted Belgian conductor, will make his second appearance as guest conductor of the symphony during the Saturday broadcast at 10 p. m., over WJZ. Defauw has programmed Handel's Concerto Grosso in D Minor as the opening selection for the concert. He also will direct the symphony in Respighi's "Gli Ucelli" and the concluding number, Franck's Symphony in D Minor.

The Stacey Sisters, Marie aged 20, and Nola, aged 18, will be featured on the Grand Ole Opry program Saturday, 9:30 p. m. over WEAJ. They'll sing "Old Pal of Yesterday" and "Riding Down The Canyon." Roy Acuff and his Smoky Mountain boys will feature "The Great Speckled Bird" and "Get Along Home Cindy." Ford Rush's numbers will be "I Want A Girl" and "I'm Looking Over a Four Leaf Clover."

Happy Jack Turner, pianist-singer, will drop in on the National Bran Dance, Saturday, to perform for Uncle Ezra and the gang over WJZ at 9 p. m. Return appearances will be made by Jane Kaye, torchsinger, and Bobby Hastings, boy soprano, who commutes to Chicago from Brooklyn for the broadcasts.

Sigmund Spaeth, "Tune Detective" of radio, author of such popular books as "Music for Everybody," "Read 'Em and Weep," etc., writer for various newspapers and magazines, maker of motion pictures, and a stage personality of the first order, is going to try and match his wits Saturday against
